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**Major Champions Mike Weir, Retief Goosen, Vijay Singh and Tom Lehman Book Tickets to
2026 Rogers Charity Classic**

CALGARY – Two World Golf Hall of Famers. Seven major championships. More than 50 PGA TOUR titles. One Canadian golf legend.

With just two weeks until the stars of the PGA TOUR Champions descend on Calgary, the latest player commitments for the 2026 Rogers Charity Classic promise another world-class field with **Mike Weir, Retief Goosen, Vijay Singh** and **Tom Lehman** set to tee it up at Canyon Meadows Golf & Country Club, August 17-23.

"We're thrilled to welcome four more of golf's biggest names to this year's Rogers Charity Classic," said Sean Van Kesteren, Executive Director, Rogers Charity Classic. "Mike, Retief, Vijay and Tom have each left an incredible mark on the game, and their commitment adds even more excitement for our fans. Their accomplishments speak for themselves, and we're proud to have them competing in Calgary while helping us continue to make a meaningful impact for children's charities across Alberta."

Making his sixth consecutive appearance at the Rogers Charity Classic, Team Rogers athlete Mike Weir returns to his home country looking to contend in front of Canadian fans once again. The eight-time PGA TOUR winner captured his first PGA TOUR Champions victory at the 2021 Insperity Invitational. His best result in Calgary came in 2021 when he finished tied for ninth.

"This is one of the premier events on the PGA TOUR Champions, and I always really look forward to playing in Canada," said Weir. "All of the players really love it. I know the guys are looking forward to getting up there, and that goes without saying for me to come home, see family and friends. I've been lucky enough to win in Vancouver at the Air Canada Championship on the PGA TOUR. It's very special when you win at home. I'd love to play well in Calgary and put myself into contention."

Two-time U.S. Open champion Retief Goosen is also heading north. Renowned for his smooth swing and calm demeanor under pressure, the South African captured U.S. Open titles in 2001 and 2004, won seven times on the PGA TOUR and was named the 2001 European Tour Player of the Year. Goosen was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2019.

"I played in Canada many times over the years, so it is nice to come out to this part of the world," said Goosen, who has won five times on the PGA TOUR Champions. "I spent time out at Lake Louise and did a bit of the sightseeing stuff and climbing up and down the glaciers when I was there last. It's a wonderful part of the country and the golf course was in great condition, so I am very much looking forward to getting back up there."

A former world No. 1, Vijay Singh returns to Calgary for his ninth Rogers Charity Classic appearance. The Fijian legend owns 34 PGA TOUR victories, including three major championships - the 2000 Masters Tournament along with the 1998 and 2004 PGA Championships. He famously defeated Mike Weir in a playoff to win the 2004 Canadian Open. Now competing on PGA TOUR Champions, Singh has added five victories on the senior circuit.

"I have fond memories of playing in Canada," said Singh, who was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2006. "The fans share my passion for the game and have always treated me with great respect. I am excited to have the opportunity to try and win another title in Canada this August."

Rounding out the group is Tom Lehman. The 1996 Open Championship winner brings one of the most unique resumes in professional golf. He remains the only player to earn Player of the Year honours on the Korn Ferry Tour (then Ben Hogan Tour), PGA TOUR and PGA TOUR Champions, while also reaching world No. 1 during his distinguished career.

Earlier this spring, the Rogers Charity Classic rolled out another impressive group of player commitments, highlighted by the return of World Golf Hall of Famer **Bernhard Langer**, who will make his first appearance in Calgary since 2021. Joining the legendary German will be major champion **David Duval**, along with **Rocco Mediate**, winner of the inaugural Rogers Charity Classic in 2013. One of the game's most charismatic personalities, **Miguel Angel Jiménez**, will also once again headline the field.

The final field for the 2026 Rogers Charity Classic will be announced on August 14.
